What Yeshua said about his Purpose

Peer Review: Fulfilling Scripture

1 Thessalonians 5:21 Test everything! Grasp a hold of that which is determined to be true.

Proverb 18:17 The first to present his case seems right, until another comes forward and examines him.

Peer Review is a process that journals and white papers use to ensure the information that is published represents the best scholarship currently available.

What should happen is that when a journal or white paper is ready to be published, the editors should send it out to other scholars to get their opinion on the quality of the scholarship, its relevance to the field, its appropriateness for publication, an evaluation of its sources, etc. Unfortunately, for the Hebrew Roots world, this seldom happens.

We, at the House of David Fellowship, will attempt to help fill this void. Our first assignment will be due January 1st, 2011. We will publish the results on our Blog for public consumption and debate. I expect to officially publish both the Website, the Facebook Ministry page and the Blog before then.

What About Scripture: Mark 7:18-19 — Follow-up
